**7. What changes would make the planning process for FEAT more effective?**

*Involve more family members, give them support to attend*  
*Involving more OBs in the planning process*  
*Hosting a local conference*  
*Consider nominating a "leader" for each smaller group, to coordinate work.*  
*Flexible meeting schedule, or chain email discussions.*  
*Could be more focused with clear timelines for accomplishing tasks*  
*Time between meetings sometimes seems too long to remember all of the issues and to remain highly motivated; meet more often*  
*Meetings feel very rushed and chaotic, difficult to focus*  
*Try to minimize recapping ground rules and previous discussions at each meeting, wasting valuable time*  
*No changes (3 replies)*
